

having received of the Father the promise of the Holy Ghost, he hath shed forth this, **which ye now see and hear.**

1. ³⁴ For David is not ascended into the heavens: but he saith himself, The LORD said unto my Lord, Sit thou on my right hand, ³⁵ Until I make thy foes thy footstool. ³⁶ Therefore let all the house of Israel know assuredly, that God hath made that same Jesus, whom ye have crucified, both Lord and Christ.
2. ³⁷ Now when they heard *this*, they were pricked in their heart, and said unto Peter and to the rest of the apostles, Men *and* brethren, what shall we do?

Purpose of the Holy Spirit:

Jesus is enthroned. He is seated on the Right Hand of the Throne! Mark 16:19; Acts 7:55; Romans 8:3. The gift of tongues given by the Holy Spirit was to confirm that Jesus was placed on the Right Hand of the Throne.

“When Christ passed through the heavenly gates, He was enthroned amidst the adoration of the angels. As soon as this ceremony was completed, the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples in rich currents, and was indeed glorified, even with the glory which he had from the Father from all eternity.” “The Pentecostal outpouring was Heaven’s communication that the Redeemer’s inauguration was accomplished. According to His promise He had sent the Holy Spirit from heaven to His followers as a token that He had, as priest and king, received all authority in heaven and on earth, and was the Anointed One over His people.” AA p. 38.

Joseph was a type of Christ. Joseph sent gifts to convince his father that he was alive and second in command of Egypt. Genesis 45:9, 13,23, 26,27-28

Ephesians 2:18. For through him we both have access by one Spirit unto the Father. John 14:6. Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me.

3. Prophecy: But this is that which was spoken by the prophet Joel; ¹⁷ And it shall come to pass in the last days, saith God, I will pour out of my Spirit upon all flesh: and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams: ¹⁸ And on my servants and on my handmaidens I will pour out in those days of my Spirit; and they shall prophesy: ¹⁹ And I will shew wonders in heaven above, and signs in the earth beneath; blood, and fire, and vapour of smoke: ²⁰ The sun shall be turned into darkness, and the moon into blood, before that great and notable day of the

Lord come: ²¹ And it shall come to pass, *that* whosoever shall call on the name of the Lord shall be saved.

4. Application: ²² Ye men of Israel, hear these words; Jesus of Nazareth, a man approved of God among you by miracles and wonders and signs, which God did by him in the midst of you, as ye yourselves also know:
